

## **2013 – 14 PPG Interventions**

Total PP Students on roll = 223 (25% of nor)

At Longfield Academy we have a holistic approach to supporting students who have been nationally identified as Pupil Premium (PP). It is fully accepted that good teaching narrows gaps in attainment, but to improve outcomes for learners vulnerable to under achievement we have a personalised provision that is not only linked to aspects of achievement in the classroom, but also to attendance, aspiration and wider experiences. Our small school structure has increased the level of personalisation we can give our students. All PP students are supported by a mentor who identifies the needs of each individual through discussions with the student, parents and teachers.

Our PP mentor is Phil Ellis. He is involved in all aspects of the education of PP students. This has primarily been focused around the attendance and welfare of the students, and is now moving more towards the academic support. He tracks progress and interventions with students and engages with parents on a regular basis.
